

- The result: Persistent local problems, citizen apathy, and a growing gap in trust and accountability.


We Built a Platform to Hear the Signal in the Noise.



Khara Sach is a national, non-partisan digital ecosystem designed to capture, categorize, and channel citizen feedback directly to the relevant corridors of power.

It transforms individual grievances and suggestions into clear, actionable, data-driven insights.

A Connected Ecosystem for a More Responsive Government




Citizens: Submit feedback on any issue, from critical infrastructure failures to positive community developments.

Khara Sach Engine:Intelligently processes, tags, and routes every submission based on geography and department.

Officials: Receive tailored dashboards and reports with real-time insights from their constituencies.

Structured Data for Precise Accountability



Information is accessible from multiple levels, ensuring data reaches the right person, automatically.

Every piece of feedback is mapped to a precise political and administrative hierarchy. An issue in Gulshan is not just a general complaint; it is logged against a specific constituency, a specific MNA, and the relevant municipal department. This structure is the foundation of true, measurable accountability.

Capturing the Complete On-Ground Picture






The Journey of a Single Voice: A Case Study



A citizen in Lahore reports a blocked sewer with a photo and location.

Khara Sach automatically routes the report to the local water board and flags it on the MNA's dashboard.


The issue is escalated. A municipal team is dispatched and resolves the problem.

The citizen is notified. The MNA's 'Issues Resolved' metric improves. The area's sentiment score trends upward.






Our Guiding Principle: To Be the Custodian of the Truth
